Mayor Kleiss called a public meeting to order at 6:45 PM. The purpose of the hearing was to allow questions or comments on the proposed FY 24 appropriation ordinance. Sarah Rusher, 300 East Pinzon, addressed council about the possibility of allowing residents to raise hens in their backyards. Rusher stated there are many pros to having backyard hens and addressed common rules and regulations for backyard coops. Rusher pointed out many area communities allow backyard hens. Rusher went on to say she had generated an informal petition via facebook and has received over 100 signatures in favor of raising backyard hens. Council thanked Rusher and told her they would discuss and make a decision at a later date about whether or not backyard hens would be allowed in the city.
